## Resilient Communities Project-Carver County 2015-2016 Partnership

The mission of the Resilient Communities Project is to connect communities in Minnesota with the wide-ranging expertise of University of Minnesota faculty and students to address pressing local issues in ways that advance sustainability and resilience.



During the 2015–2016 academic year, RCP collaborated with Carver County and its partner organizations and agencies on 30 community-identified projects. These projects were matched with 50 courses spanning 22 departments across 8 colleges at the University of Minnesota Twin Cities campuses, engaging more than 350 students in meaningful real-world projects, and providing Carver County with information, ideas, and new perspectives on local sustainability and resilience issues.
